

# Perception and Reality. Evaluation of Elite Football Women's and Men's Performance

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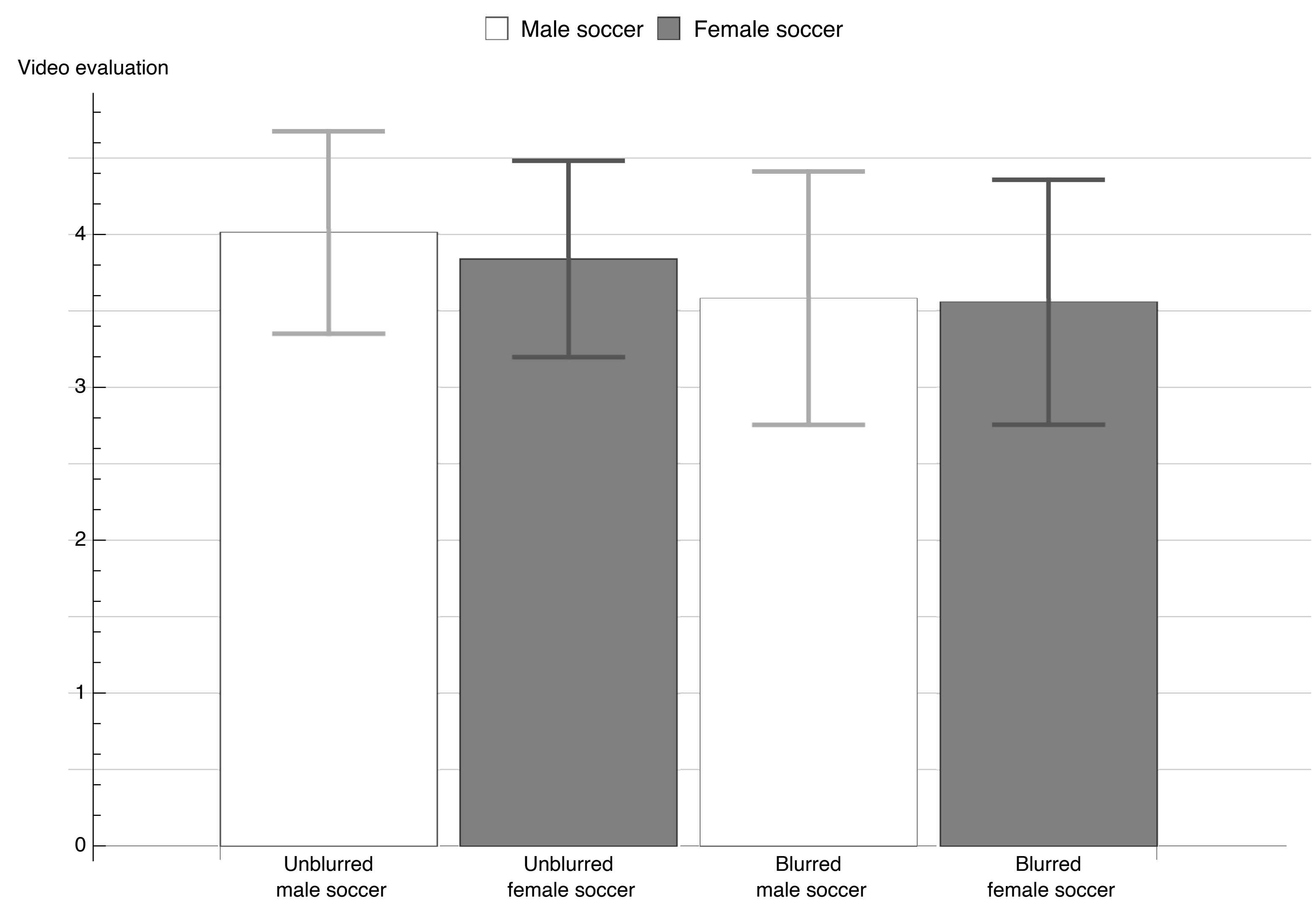
## Overview

- In this paper, we want to detect if the viewers evaluation is biased when seeing the gender of the players.
- We use videos of professional women and men soccer players to test this hypothesis, blurring the players to conceal their gender.
- We randomly show participants either the original unblurred videos or the blurred videos.

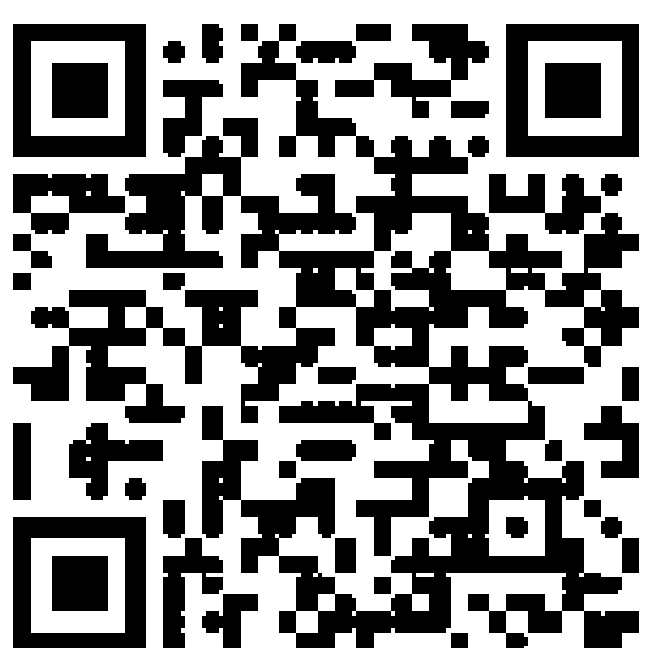
## Original video frame (L) and blurred video frame (R)

## Results

- Participants prefer men's soccer videos when the gender of the players is visible
- Participants have no preference when the gender of the players is blurred
