Re: Disclosure statement for "Price Floors and Employer Preferences"

1. **Financial support.** Some of the work on this project was done while I was an employee of the platform on which the experiment was conducted. I left the firm in 2013, but continued to have access to their data, in exchange for unpaid advising that I provide from time to time. At the time of the original submission, I had no financial interest in the platform. In 2019-2020, I took a leave of absence from MIT and worked full-time for the platform again, and continue to do paid consulting now. However, I have a separate research agreement with the platform that allows me to select what topics I work on and to publish without prior review.

2. **Right to review.** No party (including the platform) had the right to review this work, nor did the platform review this work.

3. **IRB.** As the experiment was run by the platform to answer a business question, when I was not a faculty member, no ex ante IRB approval was sought. However, since joining MIT, I applied to MIT's IRB approval to use this as secondary data and the project was ruled exempt, given that it is full anonymized.
