

**Goodman and Isen. "Un-Fortunate Sons: Effects of the Vietnam Draft Lottery on the Next Generation's Labor Market"**

This zip file contains the stata file "goodmanisen\_code.do," which generates all estimates presented in the figures and tables of the paper.

The program starts from a dataset linking the draft number-by-birthdate dataset to a dataset constructed from confidential IRS tax records of men born in the draft cohorts and members of their 1996 household containing their earnings, employer, and other information by upstream SAS code (not included here).

The draft number-by-birthdate dataset was obtained from the additional online materials published with Angrist and Chen (2011)—namely, `dobrsn20091215.dta` within [https://www.aeaweb.org/aej/app/data/2009-0251\\_data.zip](https://www.aeaweb.org/aej/app/data/2009-0251_data.zip).

Researchers can submit an application to obtain access to the IRS tax data via the Statistics of Income Joint Statistical Research Program (<https://www.irs.gov/statistics/soi-tax-stats-joint-statistical-research-program>).
